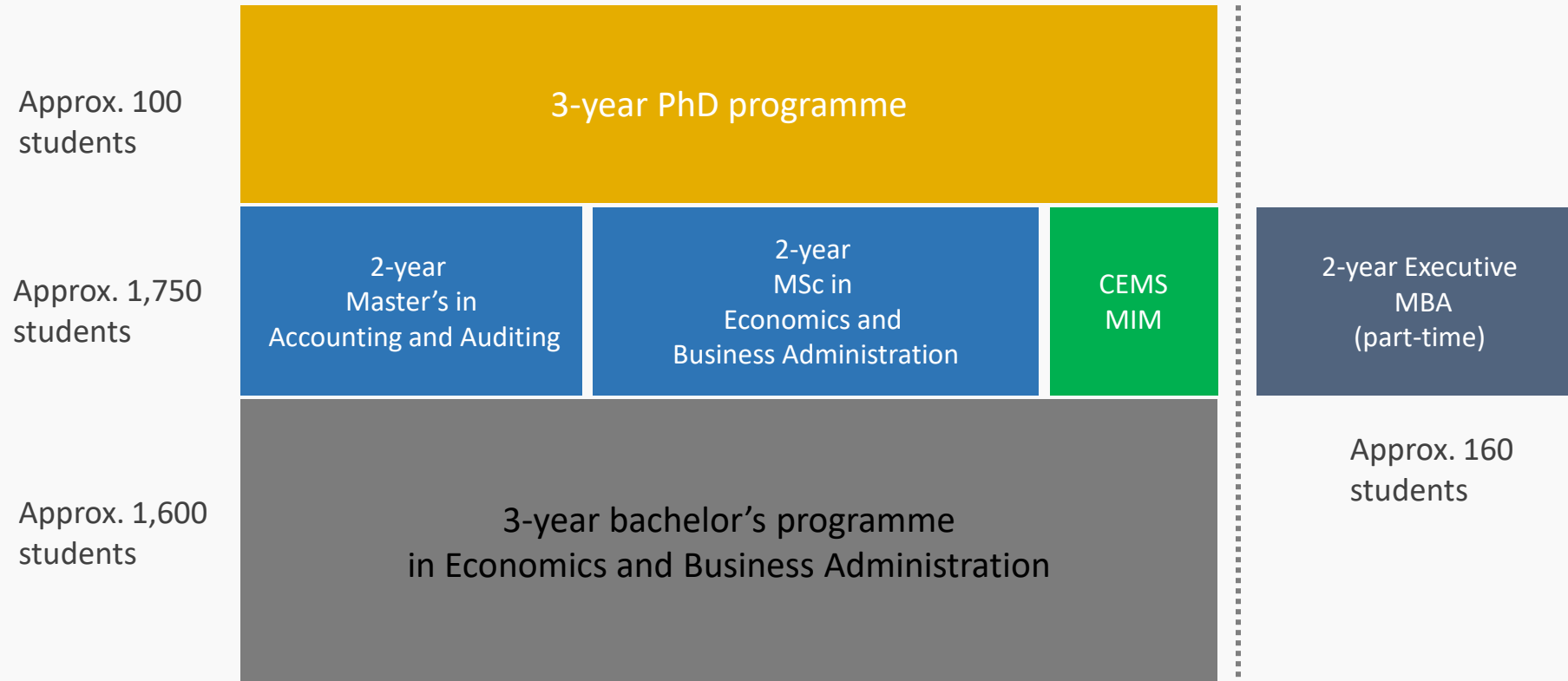

- Teaching mainly in English
- Gives the title MSc in Economics and Business Administration
- Final part of the 5-year siviløkonom programme for those admitted based on
 - Bachelor i Økonomi og Administrasjon (BØA)
 - Bachelor i Regnskap og Revisjon (BRR)

Programme structure

- Major (hovedprofil)
 - Six courses (45 ECTS) from one of the majors
 - A master thesis (30 ECTS) on a topic within your major
- Electives
 - Six courses (45 ECTS)
 - Norwegian (siviløkonom) students must take at least three of these courses outside of their major
 - Some of the electives can be combined as a minor on the diploma

Programme requirements

- Mandatory core courses
 - Specific requirements for each major!
- At least one course (7,5 ECTS) in empirical methods
 - Ensures good methodological skills
 - Useful for your thesis work
 - Course must be chosen within your major
 - See description of individual majors for available courses
- Everybody must take an ethics course – at least 2,5 ECTS
 - The ethics course can be taken as part of the major or as one of the electives
