



Agreement on electronic publication of PhD thesis through NHH Brage

This agreement applies to electronic publication of the scientific work:

The agreement is entered into between The Norwegian School of Economics (NHH) and authonomics)r: -

Objective

The objective of this agreement is to make scientific documents available through the institutional archive of NHH - NHH Brage.

Contents of the agreement

The material will be published under a Creative Commons attribution-noncommercial-nonderivatives 4.0 public license (https://creativecommons.org/licenses/by-nc-nd/4.0/legalcode):

- NHH may publish the material in NHH Brage, free of charge, for a non-commercial purpose.
- The author may publish his or her material in NHH Brage, free of charge
- The reader may search, read, copy or distribute the unaltered material, free of charge, for a non-commercial purpose

Publishing and re-use of the material must be within the scope of the Norwegian Copyright Act

The obligations of the parties

NHH commits to publishing the authors document(s) in electronic format in NHH Brage.

- The document will be published as the author submits it, without any adjustment or editing from NHH,
- The author is responsible for the contents, and may reserve the right to approve the electronic version before publication.
- The author shall deliver the document(s) in an electronic format.

Rights to the document

The author guarantees that he/she is the author of the document. The copyright of the document(s) belongs to the author. Publication in NHH Brage will not limit this right. The author guarantees that he/she has the necessary permission from any co-authors.

The author also guarantees that for the use of any other copyrighted material in the document, that the necessary permission from any third parties is gathered. If the document is formerly published, the NHH library will clarify the rights of the document with the publisher before electronic publication in NHH Brage.

Intellectual property rights (IPR)

If the author is the sole author of the material, she or he has the sole copyright for the work. If the material consists of a collection of articles and a summary/abstract (i.e. a PhD-thesis), the author has the sole copyright for the parts that are the result of his/her independent creative efforts. Articles by a number of authors where it is impossible to identify individual contributions, as separate works will be considered a joint work. The authors will have joint copyright on such articles.
