GLAD NEWSLETTER #7 – SUMMER 2020 (July 21)

Status of the GLAD A-Z Database

Since our previous newsletter (# 6, Fall 2019), we have received another batch of Anglicisms from several of the 17 languages now represented in the A-Z database. However, there is still a lot of work to be done before all languages are covered A-Z, and the deadline is less than a year ahead. We therefore encourage all GLAD contributors – now receiving special mention on top of the Members list on our website – to make sure that they meet the May 1, 2021, deadline. As is obvious from the updated table below, contributors for Bulgarian, Cantonese and Galician have stopped submitting entries to the database, so others who want to take over as contributors to these languages are more than welcome!

As of June 2020, we have received entries (including items to be resubmitted) from GLAD contributors working with the following 17 languages:

Several languages are up to date, although (as mentioned in the previous Newsletter) the number of items per letter submitted vary more than the differences between languages may justify. We hope this will be remedied before the May 2021 deadline, together with the missing letters.

In addition to the languages already represented in the database, recent contributors for Albanian, Russian and Romanian have promised to deliver material soon.

Upcoming conferences

Due to the coronavirus pandemic, three of the four 2020 conferences of interest to GLAD members (mentioned in the previous Newsletter) have been canceled or postponed:

- The conference English and American Studies in the Age of Post-truth & Alternative Reality (with its "Language Contact" session) to be held in Cracow this April, was canceled. No new dates are given: https://april.confer.uj.edu.pl.
- The organizers of the 15th ESSE conference (including a seminar called "Borrowings and loan translations from English multi-word units in other European languages") that was to be held in Lyon late this August state on the conference website: "We remain hopeful that the conference itself can be rescheduled for 30 August / 3 September 2021 with a minimal number of adjustments. 
However, the Societas Linguistica Europaea meeting in Bucharest (http://sle2020.eu), goes online:
