Tina Søreide is Professor of Law and Economics at the *Norwegian School of Economics (NHH)*, Department of Accounting, Auditing and Law. Her research is focused on corruption, governance, markets and development, currently with an emphasis on law enforcement. She was previously employed by the *Faculty of Law, University of Bergen (UiB)*, the *Chr. Michelsen Institute (CMI)* and the *World Bank*, Washington DC. In academia, she has given several academic courses on governance dysfunctions and corruption. Her research is published internationally in books, academic journals and policy reports (listed separately), and she has acted as the editor of two volumes. Her most recent book, *Corruption and Criminal Justice: Bridging Legal and Economic Perspectives*, was published by Edw. Elgar in 2016. Søreide has also been engaged in policy work, both for the Norwegian Government and internationally, including assignments for the OECD, the EU, the World Bank, development agencies and governments - several times as the project leader. She is a member of the High Level Advisory Group on Anticorruption and Integrity (HLAG) to the Secretary General of the OECD.
